NOMADS OF PATAGONIA ROUTE PROGRAM

8-DAY / 7-NIGHT CRUISE

THURSDAY, APRIL 22, 2027: Optional additional night on board M/V Skorpios III (Additional cost).

From **06:00 p.m.** Passenger reception. The additional night includes dinner, accommodation on board, and breakfast on the day of departure.

FRIDAY, APRIL 23, 2027: 11:00 a.m. Departure from Puerto Natales. Sail through the Kirke Narrows and Fjord of the Mountains en route to the Bernal Glacier, arriving around **04:30 p.m.** Disembark for a guided walk to the glacier, followed by a water supply maneuver. At **08:00 p.m.**, continue northbound, navigating through Morla Vicuña Pass, Unión Channel, Collingwood Strait, Sarmiento Channel, and Peel Inlet.



SATURDAY, APRIL 24, 2027: 8:30 a.m. Arrival at the Amalia Glacier, with a panoramic view from the ship followed by a landing on shore. At **10:30 a.m.**, sail towards El Brujo Glacier, arriving around **12:30 p.m.** for another disembarkation and close-up encounter with the ice. At **3:00 p.m.**, continue towards the mighty Pío XI Glacier. During the afternoon and evening, the voyage continues through Peel Inlet and the scenic channels of Pitt, Tres Cerros, Concepción, Wide, Icy, and Eyre Fjord.

SUNDAY, APRIL 25, 2027: 08:00 a.m. Arrival at Pío XI Glacier. The vessel will sail in front of this colossal ice mass, the largest glacier in South America. **11:00 a.m.** Departure from Pío XI Glacier to navigate through Eyre Fjord, Grappler Channel, and Paso del Indio, arriving at Puerto Edén at **03:30 p.m.** Disembarkation and visit to this fishing village located on Wellington Island, cradle of the Kaweskar (Alacaluf) people. **05:30 p.m.** Departure northwards to sail through English Narrows and Messier Channel, heading towards Caleta Tortel.

MONDAY, APRIL 26, 2027: 09:00 a.m. Arrival at Caleta Tortel. Disembarkation in this village, which features 7 km of wooden walkways. **12:00 p.m.** Departure towards the Quitalco Hot Springs. Beginning of navigation through the Gulf of Penas and the Pacific Ocean.

TUESDAY, APRIL 27, 2027: 08:00 a.m. End of ocean navigation and beginning of channel navigation through Anna Pink Bay. **12:00 p.m.** Arrival at Quitalco Hot Springs.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 28, 2027: 08:00 a.m. Docked at the Quitalco pier. Thermal baths and boat rides through the inner waters of the fjord. Patagonian barbecue lunch. **05:00 p.m.** Departure towards the city of Dalcahue in Chiloé.

THURSDAY, APRIL 29, 2027: 04:30 p.m. Arrival at the city of Dalcahue. Disembarkation and visit of the place. Departure from Dalcahue at **08:00 p.m.** At **09:00 p.m.** Final farewell dinner.

FRIDAY, APRIL 30, 2027: 08:00 a.m. Arrival at the Skorpios Terminal in Puerto Montt. Guests enjoy breakfast before disembarking. The cruise concludes — marking the end of an unforgettable Patagonian journey.

SPECIAL CRUISE: THE HIGHLIGHTS

AMALIA GLACIER

Following Peel Fjord, we encounter Amalia Glacier, located in the central part of the Southern Patagonian Ice Field, the third-largest freshwater reserve in the world. Its graceful silhouette appears to descend from the surrounding mountains, creating a truly spectacular sight. Towering walls of ice and vivid shades of blue contrast dramatically with the surrounding landscape, inspiring a sense of wonder in every visitor. Amalia Glacier is approximately 2.5 km wide and 70 meters high. Its immense ice mass is sustained by heavy snowfall throughout much of the year. In this extraordinary setting of pristine natural beauty, the M/V Skorpions III approaches the glacier's face, cruising from south to north to reveal its full splendor. Adding to the glacier's scientific significance is Volcán Reclus, which rises from beneath its ice. Its unique location and behavior make it a fascinating subject of study and a remarkable mystery for volcanologists.



EL BRUJO GLACIER

At the end of Asia Fjord lies a magnificent glacier whose breathtaking surroundings leave a lasting impression on every visitor: El Brujo Glacier. Our adventure begins by boarding the excursion boats and approaching the glacier, where we disembark onto a formation of magmatic rock. This unique vantage point allows us to appreciate the extraordinary power of the glacier and its role in shaping the landscape. From here, we enjoy a privileged panoramic view of its immense ice wall.



PÍO XI GLACIER

Heading north through the waters of Eyre Sound, nature reveals an awe-inspiring spectacle of immense proportions: the imposing Pío XI Glacier. The frontal wall of this frozen giant is approximately 6 km wide, with an average height of 75 meters, while some of its towering ice formations reach up to 90 meters. Covering approximately 1,265 km², it is the largest glacier in the Southern Hemisphere. To appreciate its immense scale, its surface area is comparable to that of a city as large as Santiago, Chile. One of its most remarkable characteristics is that it is one of the few glaciers in the world that continues to advance. In fact, over the past 50 years, its terminus has advanced by more than 10 km. As we navigate among the icebergs calved by the glacier into the sea, we experience the extraordinary power and beauty of Patagonia's wilderness—a journey that inspires awe and creates a profound connection with nature.



SPECIAL CRUISE: THE HIGHLIGHTS

PUERTO EDÉN

A remote fishing village located on Wellington Island, Puerto Edén is home to the Kawéskar (or Alacalufe) people. The small community has approximately 300 inhabitants, most of whom make their living through artisanal fishing. Visitors also have the opportunity to purchase traditional handicrafts made by the last descendants of the Kawéskar people, preserving and celebrating their rich cultural heritage.

CALETA TORTEL

With approximately 600 inhabitants, Caleta Tortel is located in the Aysén Region, between the Northern and Southern Patagonian Ice Fields. Surrounded by islands, channels, and estuaries, the village is set amid extraordinary natural beauty. Tourism has flourished alongside traditional activities such as fishing and the harvesting of Guaitecas cypress. Caleta Tortel is renowned for its distinctive wooden houses and more than 7 km of cypress walkways, stairways, and bridges, which serve as the village's streets and connect its different areas.

QUITRALCO FJORD

Set within an ancient glacial valley and surrounded by towering, snow-capped mountains and lush, pristine vegetation, Quitalco Fjord offers a tranquil retreat in a unique and sheltered microclimate. Its calm, crystal-clear waters provide the perfect setting for an unforgettable experience. Exclusively for our passengers, Skorprios offers the opportunity to relax in natural thermal waters, heated by volcanic activity to temperatures of 32°C–38°C, in both indoor and outdoor pools. Walks through the surrounding southern temperate rainforest offer another wonderful way to experience the beauty of this remote fjord. Here, we will also enjoy a traditional Chilean and Patagonian barbecue around the Skorprios fire pit. In the native language, Quitalco means “Waters of Fire.”

DALCAHUE, CHILOÉ

Dalcahue, located in the central part of Chiloé, is the original homeland of the Huilliche people. Here we will spend a couple of hours visiting its streets, its handicraft fair, the Ethnographic Anthropological Museum, and the Church of Our Lady of Sorrows, declared a National Monument in 1971 and a World Heritage Site in 2000. Typical features include its wooden houses and more than 7 km of cypress walkways, stairways, and bridges used as streets.
