8-DAY / 7-NIGHT CRUISE

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 01, 2026: Optional additional night on board M/V Skorpios III (Additional cost).

From **6:00 pm.** Passenger reception. The additional night includes dinner, accommodation on board, and breakfast on the day of departure.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 02, 2026: 12:00 pm.

Departure from Puerto Montt through Tenglo Channel, Llanquihue Archipelago, view of Calbuco village, crossing the Gulf of Ancud.

5:00 pm. Navigation through the Chiloé Archipelago, Mechuque, Chauques, Caguache, and Tranqui Islands. Crossing the Gulf of Corcovado.



SATURDAY, OCTOBER 03, 2026: 7:00 am. Navigating Moraleda Channel. **8:30 am.** Arrival at the village of Puerto Aguirre, in the Guaitecas Archipelago; visit to this picturesque fishing village. **10:30 am.** Departure through Ferronave and Pilcomayo channels, Casma Passage, and Costa Channel, arriving at Quitrалco Fjord at **3:00 pm.** Disembarkation to enjoy this nature sanctuary. Thermal baths, trekking, and boat trips will be part of our activities. **8:30 pm.** Dinner at Skorpios grill house, featuring a Patagonian-style roast lamb. **12:00 am.** Departure heading south through Quitrалco Fjord and Tres Cruces Passage.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 04, 2026: Navigating Pulluche Channel and Ana Pink Bay. At dawn, the crossing of the Gulf of Penas begins. **8:00 pm.** End of the crossing, navigating through Messier Channel.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 05, 2026: T 9:00 am. Entry into Bernardo Fjord and disembarkation; possible sighting of huemules (South Andean deer). **11:00 am.** Departure toward Puerto Edén, navigating Messier Channel and crossing English Narrows, arriving at Puerto Edén at **5:00 pm.** Disembarkation in this fishing village, the birthplace of the Kaweskar (Alacalufe) ethnic group. We will walk its streets made of wooden boardwalks and take in the surrounding landscape in Patagonia. **7:00 pm.** Departure toward Pío XI Glacier, navigating through Paso del Indio and Grappler Channel. The ship will anchor at

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 06, 2026: 8:00 am. Visit to Pío XI Glacier, the largest in the Southern Hemisphere. **11:00 am.** Departure heading south through Eyre Fjord, Wide Channel, Concepción Channel, Tres Cerros Channel, and Pitt Channel, anchoring at Villarrica Cove at midnight.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 07, 2026: 8:00 am. Navigation in front of Amalia Glacier; disembarkation on the peninsula to observe the glacier-polished rocks, the local vegetation, and its high-altitude surroundings. **11:00 am.** Departure heading south through Asia Fjord. **2:30 pm.** Arrival at El Brujo Glacier; disembarkation in exploration boats toward magmatic rocks to closely observe this spectacular ice colossus and its towering peaks. **3:30 pm.** Departure toward the Fjord of the Mountains through Sarmiento and Unión channels.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 08, 2026: 8:00 am. Navigating the Fjord of the Mountains. **9:00 am.** Disembarkation at Bernal Glacier; trekking along the local moraines. **12:00 pm.** Departure heading south through Morla Vicuña Channel, crossing Kirke Narrows and Valdés Channel, arriving at Guardramiro Bay at **5:00 pm.** Disembarkation in boats to visit a colony of elephant seals. **6:00 pm.** Departure toward Puerto Natales, crossing Almirante Montt Gulf. **12:00 am.** Arriving at the Skorpios Maritime Terminal in Puerto Natales.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 09, 2026: 09:00 am Breakfast and passenger disembarkation. End of the cruise.

SPECIAL CRUISE: THE HIGHLIGHTS

PUERTO AGUIRRE

A remote fishing village located on Huichas Island within the Chonos Archipelago. Its inhabitants enjoy all the basic amenities of a city, but with the profound tranquility provided by the surrounding landscape.

QUITRALCO FJORD

An ancient glacial bed surrounded by towering snow-capped mountains, featuring impenetrable, lush, and unique vegetation in a temperate microclimate beside a calm and transparent sea. Here, Skorpios offers a paradisiacal sanctuary for the exclusive relaxation of its passengers, featuring thermal facilities with pure, warm volcanic waters ranging from 32° to 38°C (89° to 100°F).

In both indoor and outdoor pools, you can enjoy thermal baths and steam sessions. Trekking through the heart of this southern rainforest is another highlight of this stunningly beautiful fjord. Here, we will enjoy a traditional Chilean and Patagonian-style barbecue at the Skorpios grill house. In the native language, Quitalco means “Waters of Fire.”

PUERTO EDÉN

A fishing village located on Wellington Island and the birthplace of the Kaweskar (or Alacalufe) ethnic group. This small village has 300 inhabitants, most of whom are artisanal fishers. It is also possible to purchase handcrafted goods made by the last remaining descendants of the Kaweskar people.

PÍO XI GLACIER

Heading north through the waters of Eyre Sound, nature presents us with an awe-inspiring spectacle of colossal dimensions and inexplicable beauty: the imposing Pío XI Glacier. The frontal wall of this frozen giant is approximately 6 km wide with an average height of 75 meters, though some of its ice towers can reach up to 90 meters. It is the largest glacier in the Southern Hemisphere, covering 1,265 km². To understand its magnitude, its extension could house a city as large as Santiago, Chile.

One of its most notable characteristics is that it is one of the few glaciers in the world that continues to advance; in fact, over the last 50 years, it has grown by more than 10 km. Navigating among the icebergs that the glacier deposits into the sea fills us with awe and emotion, bringing us closer to nature and our inner selves.



SPECIAL CRUISE: THE HIGHLIGHTS

AMALIA GLACIER

Following the Peel Fjord, we find the Amalia Glacier, located in the central part of the Southern Patagonian Ice Field—the third-largest freshwater reserve in the world. Its long silhouette seems to drape down from the mountains; seeing it is a true spectacle. Its ice towers and the vivid color contrast with the surroundings are enough to stir the emotions of any observer.

The Amalia Glacier is approximately 2.5 km wide and 70 meters high. Its ice mass is largely fed by heavy snowfall throughout most of the year. In this paradise of natural beauty, the M/V Skorpios III approaches the face of the glacier, cruising from south to north to showcase all its splendor. Its great scientific importance lies in the fact that a volcano, named Reclus, rises from the center of its ice mass: a complete mystery to volcanologists due to its unique location and behavior.



EL BRUJO GLACIER

At the end of Asia Fjord lies a beautiful glacier whose surroundings and magnificence leave every visitor breathless: El Brujo Glacier. Our adventure consists of boarding our excursion boats to approach this site and disembark onto a magmatic rock of incomplete formation, which allows us to appreciate the shaping power of the glacier. Furthermore, we will enjoy a privileged panoramic view of its massive ice wall.
