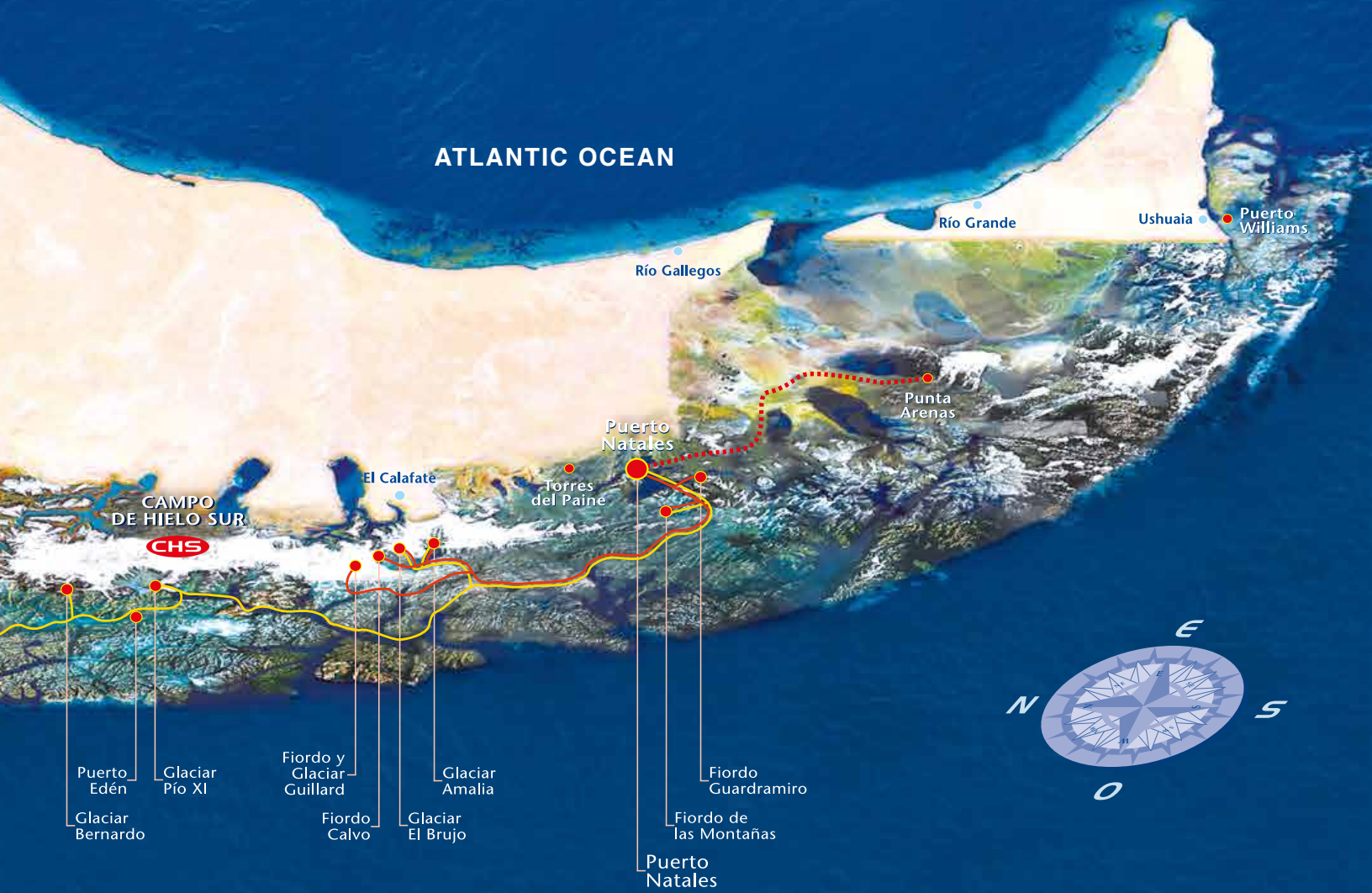

The Nomads of Patagonia Route is a 7-night journey on the Skoropios III motor vessel that takes place only twice a year, in October from Puerto Montt to Puerto Natales and in April from Puerto Natales to Puerto Montt, at the beginning and end of the Kaweskar Route Season.



This Special Cruise connects Northern and Southern Patagonia, traversing a variety of landscapes of captivating beauty. We will sail thru imposing fjords and channels, visiting the fishing villages of Puerto Aguirre, Caleta Tortel, and Puerto Edén, with their wooden walkway streets and the cradle of the Kaweskar or Alacalufe ethnicity, visiting the Bernardo, Pío XI glaciers, the largest glacier in the southern hemisphere, and the Amalia, El Brujo, and Bernal glaciers in the Southern Ice Field, and the captivating paradise of the Termas in the Quitalco Fjord.

8 DAY / 7 NIGHT CRUISE

Optional additional nite on M/N Skorpis III (additional cost). From 6:00 PM. Reception of the passengers. Accommodation on the ship. Includes dinner and breakfast on the day of departure.

DAY 1: 12:00 hrs. Departure from Puerto Montt thru Tenglo Channel, Llanquihue archipelago, view of the city of Calbuco, crossing the Gulf of Ancud. 5:00 PM Navigation thru the Chiloé archipelago, Mechuque, Chauques, Caguache, and Tranqui islands. Crossing of the Corcovado Gulf.

DAY 2: 07:00 hrs. Sailing thru the Moraleda Channel. 8:30 AM Arrival at Puerto Aguirre, in the Guaitecas archipelago, visit to this fishing village. 10:30 a.m. Departure and navigation thru Ferronave channels,

Pilcomayo, Paso Casma, Canal Costa, arriving at Quitalco Fjord at 3:00 PM. Deboard at this place to enjoy this sanctuary of nature. Hot springs, hikes, boat rides, will be part of our activities. 8:30 PM Dinner at Skorpis bonfire, with a Patagonian-style lamb roast. 12:00 AM. Departure from this place heading south thru Quitalco Fjord, Tres Cruces Pass.

DAY 3: Navigating Pulluche Canal and Ana Pink Bay. At dawn, the crossing of the Gulf of Penas begins. 8:00 PM End of the crossing, sailing thru Canal Messier.

DAY 4: 09:00 hrs. Entry to Iceberg or Bernardo Fjord. 11:00 AM Departure toward Puerto Edén, navigation thru the Messier Channel, crossing the English Narrows, arriving at Puerto Edén at 5:00 PM. Deboard in this fishing village, cradle of the Kaweskar Alacalufes ethnicity. We stroll thru its wooden walkways and its Patagonian surroundings. 7:00 PM Departure toward the Pío XI Glacier, navigating thru the Paso del Indio, Grappler Channel. Anchors and spends the nite at Pío XI Glacier.

DAY 5: 08:00 hrs. Visit to the Pío XI Glacier, the largest glacier in the Southern Hemisphere. 11:00 hrs. Departure heading south thru Eyre Fjord, Wide Channel, Concepción, Tres Cerros Channel, Pitt Channel, anchoring in Caleta Villarrica at midnight.

DAY 6: 08:00 hrs. Navigation in front of Amalia Glacier, landing on the peninsula to see the rocks polished by the glacier, its vegetation, and its higher surroundings. 11:00 AM Departure south thru Asia Fjord. 2:30 PM Arrival at the El Brujo Glacier, disembarkation in exploration boats exploration, toward some magmatic rocks to get a closer look at this ice colossus and its tall towers. 3:30 PM Departure toward the Fjord of the Mountains, thru the Sarmiento and Unión channels.

DAY 7: 08:00 hrs. Sailing the Fjord of the Mountains. 9:00 AM Disembarkation at Bernal Glacier, walk thru the local moraines. 12:00 hrs. Departure to the south, Morla Vicuña Channel, crossing Angostura Kirke, Valdés Channel, arriving at Guardramiro Bay at 5:00 PM. Deboard in boats to see a colony of elephant seals. 6:00 PM Departure toward Puerto Natales, crossing the Gulf of Almirante Montt. 12:00 AM Arriving at Puerto Natales at the Skorpis terminal.

DAY 8: 09:00 hrs. Breakfast and disembarkation of passengers. End of the Cruise.

NOTE: The cruise from Puerto Natales to Puerto Montt excludes the visit to Bahía Guardramiro and the Iceberg or Bernardo Fjord due to schedules and tides; instead, it visits Caleta Tortel. All schedules, activities, excursions, and routes are subject to change due to weather conditions and/or the safety of the vessel, as deemed appropriate by the Captain.

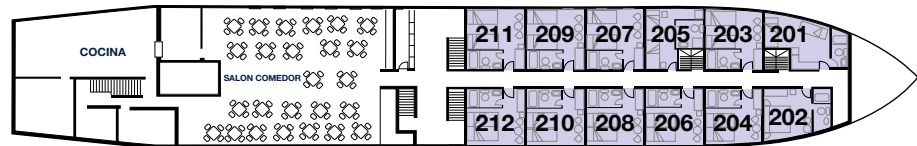
CUBIERTA ATHOS / ATHOS DECK



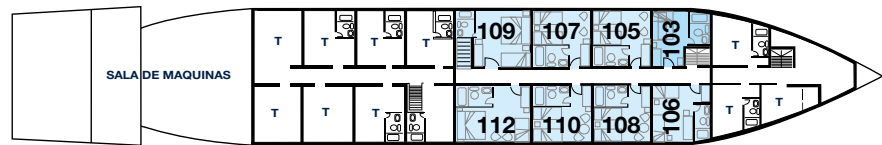
CUBIERTA OLYMPO / OLYMPUS DECK



CUBIERTA PARTHENON / PARTHENON DECK



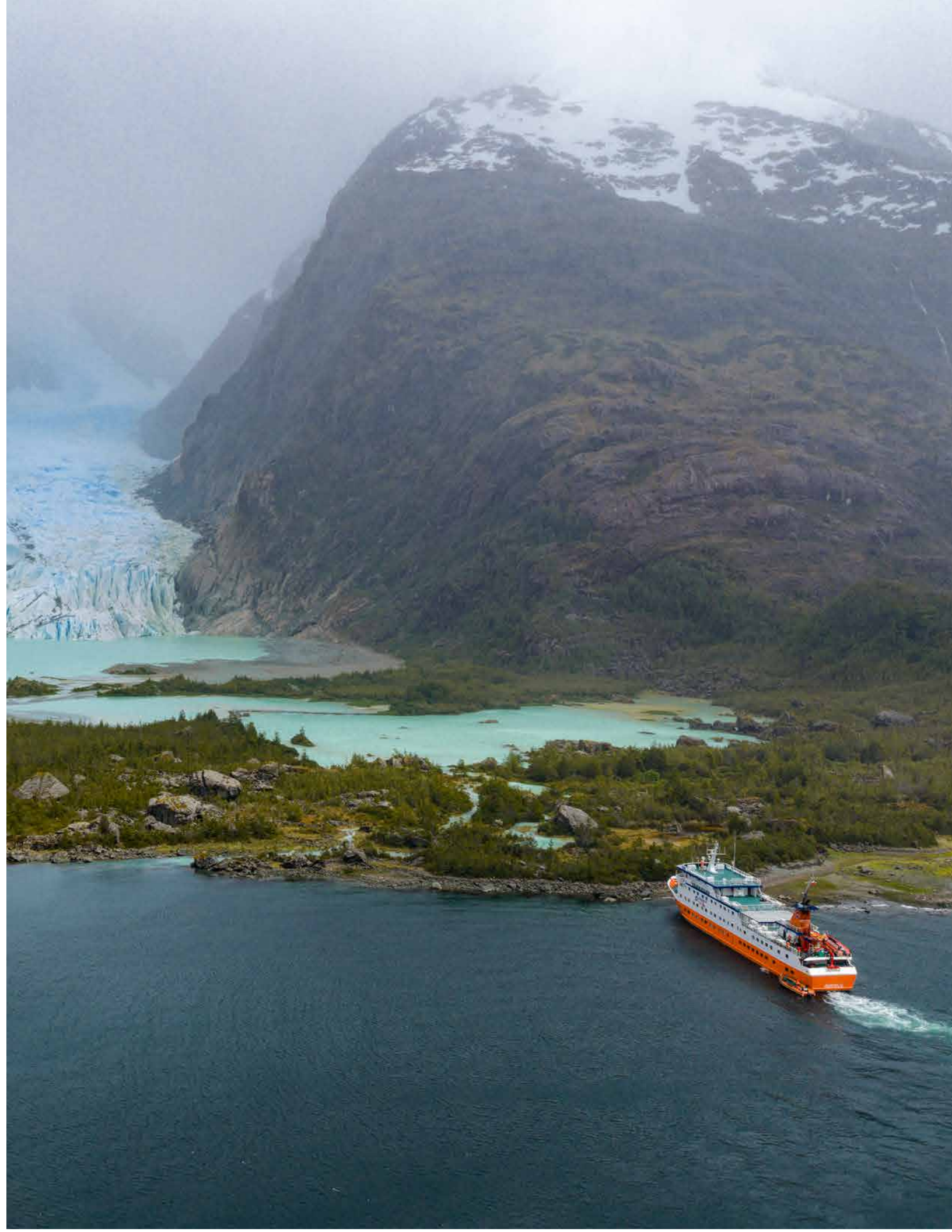

How to Get There?

TO REACH OUR DEPARTURE PORTS, SEVERAL OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE DEPENDING ON THE ROUTE YOU CHOOSE:

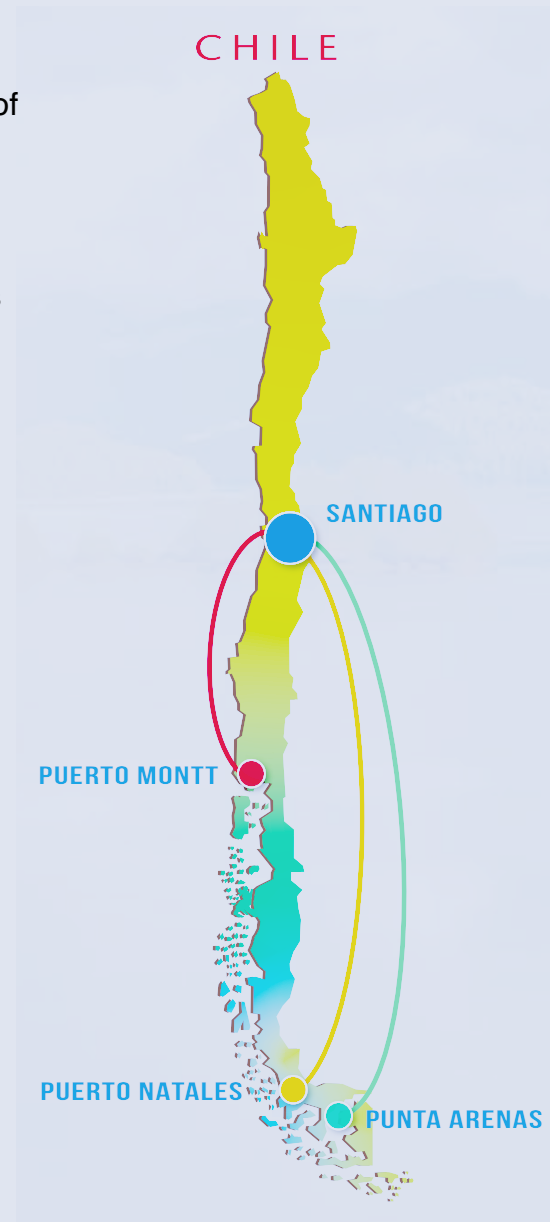
Cruises depart from and return to the city of Puerto Natales, capital of the Última Esperanza Province.

To reach this destination, you can take a commercial flight from Santiago to Punta Arenas (approximately 2,500 km, with an average flight time of 4 hours). Two airlines operate more than 10 daily flights at various times.

From Punta Arenas, you will need to arrange a transfer to Puerto Natales, located 270 km to the northwest. Transfers are provided by Skorpios (please check rates and schedules).

Since 2022, Puerto Natales has also been accessible via its local airport.

Finally, you may also cross from Argentina via El Calafate or Río Turbio, both of which have authorized border crossings into Chile.



Before You Set Sail

BASED ON OUR EXPERIENCE, WE WOULD LIKE TO OFFER YOU SOME HELPFUL TIPS FOR YOUR JOURNEY WITH SKORPIOS CRUISES:

- As this is an exploration cruise, we recommend bringing appropriate clothing for excursions. Comfortable walking shoes or hiking boots are essential, along with quick-drying pants and waterproof gear. Fleece layers, hats, and specialized jackets are highly recommended to protect against the cold and wind. A small backpack will also be useful for shore excursions.
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- On the Chonos Route, we recommend bringing a swimsuit, as the itinerary includes a visit to the Quintralco Hot Springs.
- We also suggest packing semi-formal attire for the farewell party or the Captain's Dinner.
- Don't forget sunglasses and sunscreen, as UV radiation is present year-round, even in Patagonia.
- A digital camera or video camera is ideal for capturing Patagonia's stunning landscapes—be sure to bring extra memory cards and a battery charger. A small pair of binoculars is also recommended for observing birds and wildlife from a distance.
- We encourage you to read about glaciers in advance, as this will help you better understand the glaciological terms used by our guides.
- Please remember to bring an adequate supply of any personal medications, as they will not be available for purchase on board or in the towns visited during the journey.



GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND TICKET AGREEMENT

CHONOS ROUTE – NEW KAWESKAR ROUTE – PATAGONIA NOMADS ROUTE

- In order to ensure efficient and smooth service for our passengers, compliance with the following regulations, effective January 1, 2023, is required. All previous regulations are hereby rendered null and void.
- The passenger ticket constitutes and certifies the terms and conditions of the passenger transport contract entered into between the passenger and Naviera y Turismo Skorpios S.A. (hereinafter referred to as “SKORPIOS” or “the Company”), which shall be governed by the applicable provisions of Book III of the Commercial Code of the Republic of Chile.
- Published fares may be modified at any time at the discretion of SKORPIOS, rendering any prior fare schedules void. However, if the passenger has already paid for the ticket and a modification occurs prior to the trip, such modification shall not apply, and the originally agreed price shall be honored.
- Failure of the passenger to appear at the place, date, and time indicated on the ticket, for any reason whatsoever—including unforeseen circumstances or force majeure—shall be the sole responsibility of the passenger and shall not give rise to any claim, compensation, or refund.
- SKORPIOS may postpone departure for up to 24 hours due to weather conditions or force majeure affecting the Company. If, after this period, the circumstances persist, the Company may reschedule the cruise or cancel the departure, refunding the amount paid without any additional compensation.
- Passengers may not change their assigned cabin, as indicated on the ticket, unless availability exists on board and the passenger pays any applicable fare difference prior to the change.
- Passengers may cancel or modify their trip in accordance with the following penalty schedule:
 - 120 days prior to departure: No penalty; 100% refund of the deposit paid.
 - Between 120 and 60 days: USD 200 penalty per person.
 - Between 59 and 50 days: 20% of the fare per person.
 - Between 49 and 40 days: 40% of the fare per person.
 - Between 39 and 30 days: 60% of the fare per person.
 - Between 29 and 16 days: 80% of the fare per person.
 - Between 15 and 0 days: 100% of the fare per person.
- Cancellations must be communicated via email, fax, or telephone and confirmed in writing by registered mail on the same date. The letter signed by the ticket purchaser shall be the only valid document for processing the cancellation. Refunds will be processed within 30 business days from the date of cancellation.
- The ticket may be transferred or endorsed by the passenger in whose name it was issued, provided that the Company is notified in writing, duly signed by the ticket holder, at least five (5) business days prior to departure, and that such notice is properly received by the Company. The endorsement must also be recorded on the ticket, including the signature of the endorser, their full name and identification number, as well as the full name and identification number of the endorsee or beneficiary.
- If the ticket has been purchased in installments, both the endorser and the endorsee shall be jointly and severally liable for full payment under the agreed terms.
- SKORPIOS offers complimentary safekeeping of valuables on board. Failure to use this service shall release the Company from any liability in the event of loss.
- Passengers are responsible for carrying all required and valid travel documentation, as applicable to Chilean and/or foreign citizens.
- SKORPIOS reserves the right to deny boarding to any passenger who, in its sole judgment, may disturb the well-being or safety of other passengers.
- Medical assistance on board will be provided by a physician or paramedic and is offered free of charge, including basic medical supplies. Any specific medications shall be the responsibility of the passenger. Likewise, it is the sole responsibility of the passenger to comply with any dietary or beverage restrictions prescribed by their physician. SKORPIOS may accommodate such requirements only within reasonable and feasible limits, without altering the standard food and beverage service provided on board.
- Passengers are strictly prohibited from bringing firearms or hazardous items on board. Any violation of this provision may result in immediate disembarkation by order of the Captain, without any right to claim or compensation.
- The use of drones by passengers is prohibited, as they may interfere with navigation systems and compromise the safety of the vessel and its occupants.
- The use of illegal drugs or similar substances is strictly prohibited. At the Captain’s discretion, any passenger engaging in such conduct may be disembarked to ensure the safety and well-being of others, without any right to claim or compensation against SKORPIOS.
- Pets or animals are not permitted on board SKORPIOS vessels.
- Passengers must comply with all regulations and policies issued by SKORPIOS regarding the transportation of passengers and their belongings, and must follow the Captain’s instructions at all times, both during navigation and excursions.
- In the event of pandemic or endemic situations, passengers must comply with all applicable boarding and navigation protocols in accordance with regulations in force in Chile.
- Passengers are required to read and strictly follow all safety instructions and regulations posted on board and in their cabins. Personal safety is the primary responsibility of each passenger; therefore, any actions that may compromise their physical or mental well-being must be avoided, both on board and during excursions.
- Gratuities are not included in the ticket price. Passengers may present gratuities at the end of the voyage in a sealed envelope to the Captain, who, in accordance with SKORPIOS tradition, will distribute them among all crew members. A suggested gratuity is USD 50 per passenger.
- SKORPIOS reserves the right to cancel a cruise up to 30 days prior to departure if the minimum number of passengers required for operation is not met. In such cases, the Company will first offer relocation on another SKORPIOS cruise, covering the costs of reissuing airline tickets or alternative arrangements, subject to prior quotation and approval by Cruceros Skorpios. If the passenger does not accept this alternative, the Company will refund the amount paid for the cruise, without any further liability or right to compensation.
- The safety and supervision of children on board are the sole responsibility of their parents or guardians at all times.
- SKORPIOS reserves the right to use photographs, videos, and other visual materials in which passengers may appear for advertising and promotional purposes.
- All passengers, without exception, must complete and sign a Sworn Declaration (Affidavit) at the time of boarding regarding their health condition and compliance with applicable navigation regulations.

- Excessive consumption of food and beverages, or consumption that violates medical instructions provided by the passenger's treating physician or is otherwise contraindicated for the passenger's health, shall be the sole responsibility of the passenger.
- In the event of the passenger's death prior to the cruise, the corresponding ticket may be transferred to a third party or a refund may be requested in accordance with the refund schedule set forth above.
- Transfers to and from the airports in Puerto Montt and Puerto Natales will be arranged upon request and in accordance with the applicable rate schedule. Please note that many transfers are organized on a shared basis with other passengers on the same cruise. Should a passenger require a private transfer, it must be requested in advance through Skorpios or the corresponding travel agency, subject to the applicable rates.
- CRUCEROS SKORPIOS shall not be held liable for delays caused by strikes, commercial airline delays, earthquakes, tsunamis, or any other cause not attributable to the Company. It is the sole responsibility of the passenger to be present at the port of departure for boarding at the date and time indicated on the ticket.
- CRUCEROS SKORPIOS provides accident insurance coverage for its passengers, applicable up to a maximum age of 82 years. Coverage limits are as follows:
 - Accidental death aboard the Skorpios II (Chonos Route): USD 35,000 (UF 900)
 - Accidental death aboard the Skorpios III (New Kaweskar Route and Patagonia Nomads Route): USD 230,000 (UF 6,000)
 - Permanent disability on all routes resulting from an accident: Up to USD 30,000 (UF 750)
 - Medical, pharmaceutical, and hospital expenses resulting from an accident (all routes): USD 10,000 (UF 250)
 - Emergency transfer expenses resulting from an accident (all routes): USD 8,000 (UF 200)
 - Transfer and repatriation expenses due to emergency illness (all routes): USD 4,000 (UF 100), including heart attack, stroke, or any other serious condition that, in the opinion of the onboard physician, requires immediate evacuation
 - This amount forms part of the Medical Expenses coverage. Therefore, in the event that both evacuation and medical expenses are incurred, the maximum combined coverage shall be USD 10,000 (UF 250).

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- These coverage amounts apply to foreign passengers after their individual travel insurance has been utilized. If the passenger does not hold such insurance, this coverage will apply to only 50% of the costs, up to the insured limit.
- For Chilean passengers, coverage applies after their Isapre or Fonasa health insurance, with the insured amount serving as the maximum limit.
- The values expressed in U.S. dollars are approximate, as in Chile these insurance policies are issued in UF (Unidad de Fomento).
- This coverage is included in the ticket price at no additional cost. It applies after the passenger's individual health or travel insurance, and coverage limits may be subject to adjustment in cases involving more than eight (8) passengers. Personal health and travel insurance must be arranged directly by the passenger.
- The itinerary and navigation route may be modified due to weather conditions or force majeure. Such decisions shall be made exclusively by the Captain of the vessel and shall not give rise to any claims by passengers.

Useful information

- Satellite telephone service is available on board for worldwide calls, subject to current rates (available only for Chilean passengers) and a tariffed vigente. (Solo en Chile)
- Internet access is available on board in common areas
- Starting in Costa is 220V AC (50 Hz).
- Voltaje a bordo 220 volts AC, (50 ciclos).
- An open bar is available at no additional cost, and all meals are included in the price of the cruise.
- No hay internet en el barco, salvo la señal normal en algunos lugares.
- Señal de telefonía celular, solo en algunos lugares.
- Los barcos no poseen servicio de peluquería para los pasajeros.
- No se ofrecen servicios de peluquería para los pasajeros.
- A bordo existe un servicio de lavandería sólo para prendas vivandas.
- Está prohibido fumar en dependencias interiores.
- Smoking is prohibited inside the vessel and during boat excursions. It is permitted only on open decks, subject to the weather.

- Temperaturas Ruta Nueva Baska Kaweskar:

- Temperaturas Ruta Fierro Quintupule:
 - Rango de temperaturas entre 5°C and 10°C
- Temperaturas Ruta Nomades de Patagonia:
 - Octubre: entre 8°C and 15°C
 - April: entre 9°C and 16°C
