CHONOS ROUTE ITINERARY

6-DAY / 5-NIGHT CRUISES

FRIDAY: Optional additional night. (Additional cost)

Boarding from **06:00 pm**. Includes accommodation in the same cabin as your cruise, welcome cocktail, full dinner; includes wines, beverages, liquors, and American buffet breakfast.

SATURDAY: 12:00 pm. Departure from Skorpios Terminal in Puerto Montt. Sailing through the Llanquihue Archipelago. View of the city of Calbuco. Crossing the Ancud Gulf. **04:30 pm**. Arrival in Quemchi, on the island of Chiloé. Disembarkation by boat in this picturesque town, where you may visit its handicraft center, streets and cafés, as well as the house museum of Chilean writer Francisco Coloane. **06:30 pm**. We continue sailing south through the Chiloé Archipelago, crossing the Corcovado Gulf at midnight.

SUNDAY: 08:00 am. Sailing through the Moraleda and Ferronave Channels. Arrival at Puerto Aguirre at **11:00 am**. Disembarkation in this fishing town nestled in the Chonos Archipelago, where we explore its streets, viewpoints, and the trail through a typical rainforest of the region. **01:30 pm**. Sailing through the Ferronave and Pilcomayo Channels, and Casma Passage. **04:00 pm**. Arrival at Barrientos Islet. Here we will disembark by boat, quietly approaching this group of rocky islands to visit the place that hosts the largest number of seabirds in the Aysén region, including Imperial and Red-legged Cormorants, Austral and Dominican Gulls, accompanied by South American fur seals resting on the rocks or in the sea. **05:00 pm**. Departure southbound, anchoring around **10:00 pm** at Caleta Quesahuen or Punta Leopardos, 20 miles from San Rafael Glacier.

MONDAY: 07:30 am. The vessel sails through San Rafael Bay and Témpanos Channel. **09:00 am**. Enters the lagoon and anchors 2 km from the Glacier. Motorboat excursion among multicolored icebergs, weather permitting. **02:30 pm**. The vessel approaches the Glacier. **04:00 pm**. Departure toward Quintralco Fjord.



TUESDAY: 08:00 am. Docked at Quitralco Pier. After breakfast, passengers can enjoy the hot springs at 32°C and 38°C, in indoor or outdoor pools, and take walks along the local trails. Weather permitting, motorboat excursions are offered inside the fjord. **05:00 pm.** Departure toward Chiloé, sailing through the Moraleda and Pérez Norte Channels.

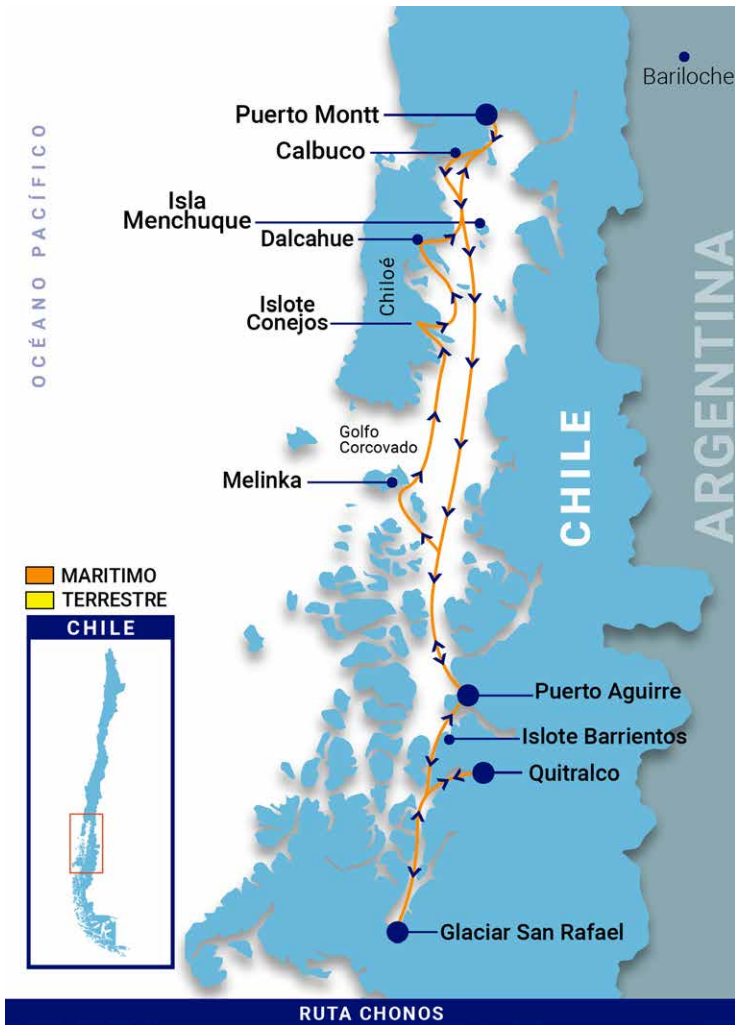


WEDNESDAY: 12:15 am. Sailing through Leucayec Channel. Crossing the Corcovado Gulf at approximately **05:30 am.** In this area, weather permitting, there is a chance to see Blue Whales, also called Alfaguaras. Continuing along the eastern coast of Chiloé, we arrive at Conejos Islet in Queilen Channel at **11:00 am.** Disembarkation for a motorboat excursion around this small island, home to Magellanic penguins and numerous local birds. **01:00 pm.** Departure, sailing between Lemuy and Chelín Islands. **04:30 pm.** Arrival at Dalcahue, disembarkation, and local visit; we recommend exploring its craft fair, church, and waterfront promenade. **11:00 pm.** Departure toward Puerto Montt. Farewell party and Captain's dinner.

THURSDAY: 08:00 am. Breakfast while docked at the Skorpios Terminal pier. **09:00 am.** Passenger disembarkation. End of our services.

Note: The itinerary and schedule may vary due to weather conditions or force majeure. Likewise, disembarkation and its duration will depend on the ship captain's authorization, who will assess the safety and ice conditions at each location. The timing of thematic talks and activities will be announced during the voyage.

CHONOS ROUTE NAVIGATION TRACK

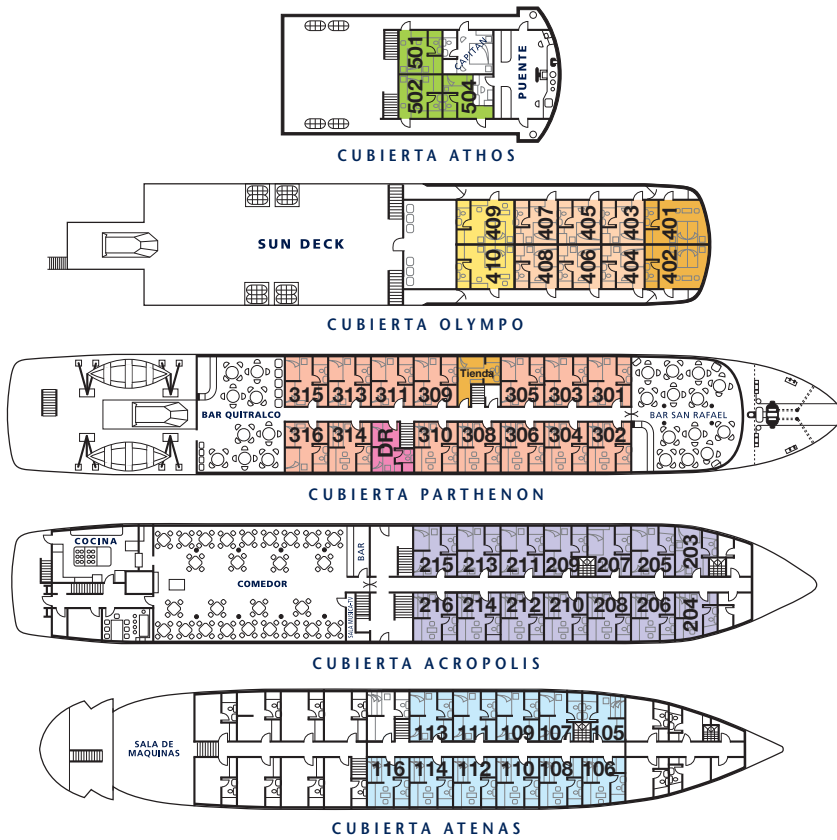


The Chonos Route, operated by M/V Skorprios II, is a 6-day, 5-night cruise that departs every Saturday from September to April from the city of Puerto Montt, located 1,000 kilometers south of Santiago, accessible by air or land. We will sail 800 miles toward San Rafael Glacier through channels and the Llanquihue, Chiloé, Chonos, and Aysén archipelagos, visiting Quemchi, Puerto Aguirre, Barrientos Islet, Quitalco hot springs, Conejos Islet, and Dalcahue. The encounter with the ancient San Rafael Glacier is a truly magical experience due to its incredible multicolored icebergs. It was named San Rafael by the Spanish Jesuit Juan García Tao, who discovered it in 1620. It is considered the glacier closest to the equator that reaches the sea. It was declared a UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve in 1978 and is a Chilean National Park. San Rafael Glacier is home to a large amount of native wildlife and is one of the most active glaciers in Patagonia in terms of ice calving, traveling 15 kilometers before depositing its ice into the calm waters of San Rafael Lagoon. Its ice towers reach up to 60 meters in height and extend down to 230 meters beneath the glacier's surface. During this unforgettable journey through breathtaking and majestic landscapes, our passengers will receive the highest level of care on board from a highly professional crew, faithfully reflecting the renowned hospitality of the Kochifas family, owners and founders of Cruceros Skorprios.





The M/V Skorprios II, with a capacity of up to 104 passengers, based on double occupancy, features 53 comfortable cabins. These include cabins with double or twin beds spread across five decks, all equipped with private bathrooms, smart TVs, and ambient music. The ship also offers 2 cozy bar lounges and a spacious dining room.

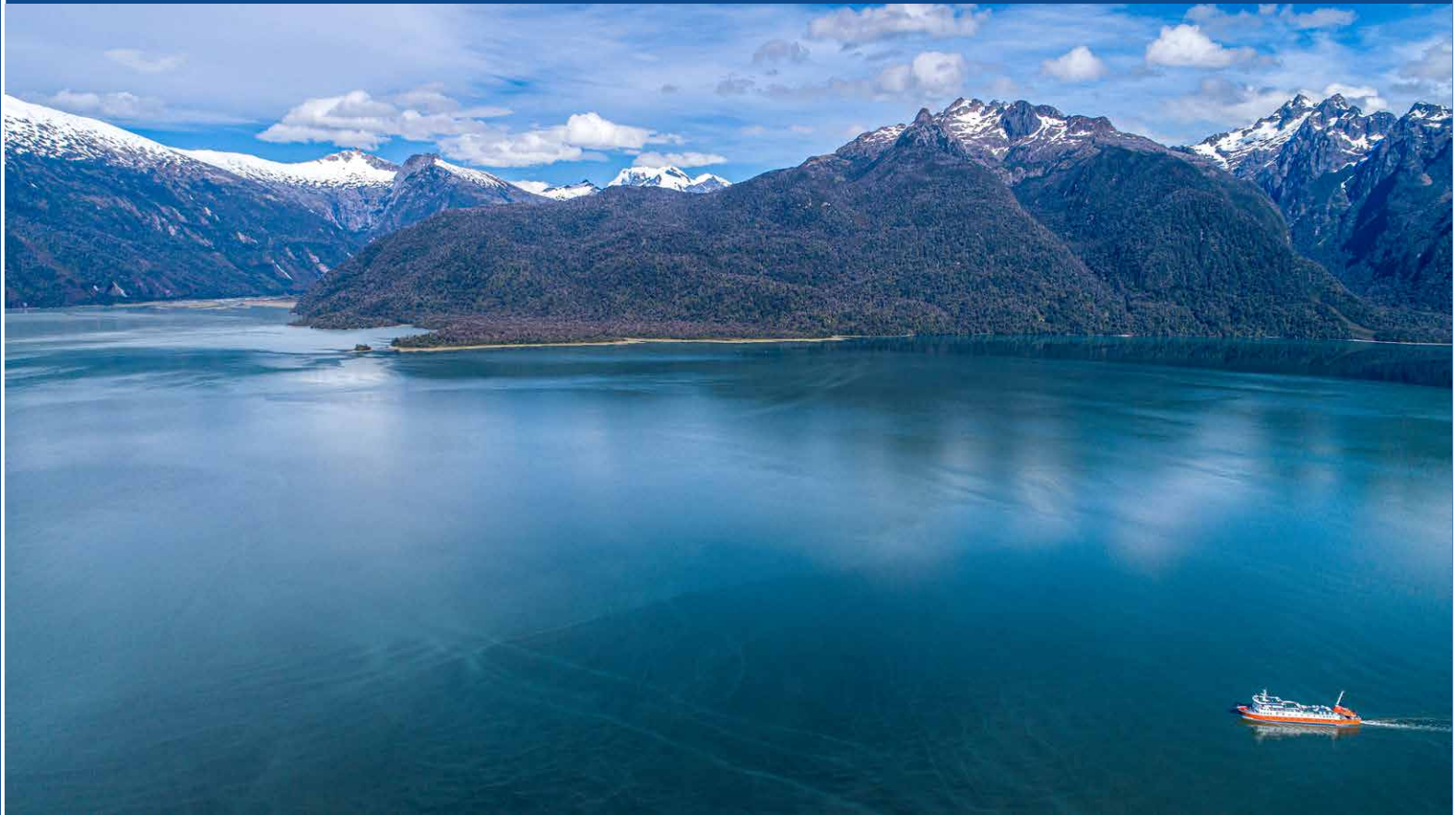


The vessel Skorprios II, call sign CBSK, IMO number 8006397, was built in Chile under Chilean and international maritime regulations such as SOLAS and IMO, and is classified by Overseas Marine Certification Services (OMCS). Class number 12823 – 9129327, valid until 10/16/2027, on which date it is automatically renewed. It also holds a valid Safety Certificate issued by the Chilean Maritime Authority (DGTM).
