FJORDS AND GLACIERS IN PATAGONIA







The Kaweskar Route is a 5-day, 4-night cruise designed to explore new territories of Chilean Patagonia aboard the M/V Skorpios III. It departs from Puerto Natales between the months of October and April each year. During the voyage, we will cover 505 miles sailing through the intricate channels and fjords of the Magallanes region toward the glaciers of the Southern Patagonian Ice Field, in an experience that will captivate and inspire those who enjoy explorations to pristine places. The area we will visit is considered the third largest freshwater reserve on the planet, and there we will visit the Guillard, Amalia, El Brujo, and the numerous glaciers of Calvo Fjord, which with their different sizes and shapes will increase the wonder of this journey, feeling the full force and majesty of nature, where we will also be able to take excursions on the icebreaker Capitán Constantino and toast with whisky with millenary ice, a true Skorpios tradition.



Next, we will visit the Mountain Fjord, exploring the Alsina and Bernal glaciers -where we will take a hike, and the Herman Glacier, with its characteristic colored icebergs. It is a unique opportunity to see the last remnants of glaciation, reaching the interior of these fjords aboard the Motor Vessel Skorpios III, with the unique and personalized service offered by Skorpios.



KAWESKAR ROUTE ITINERARY

5-DAY / 4-NIGHT CRUISES

Optional additional night before departure (Additional cost). Accommodation on the ship. Includes dinner and buffet breakfast. Optional tour Milodon Cave and surroundings (During the morning of embarkation. Additional cost).

DAY 1: 09:00 am Embarkation begins. **12:00 pm** Departure from Skorprios terminal. Ship safety briefing, location to be indicated. **02:00 pm** Lunch. Navigation through Almirante Montt Gulf. **04:30 pm** Arrival at Caleta Juárez in Guardramiro Fjord. Disembark by boat to see a sea elephant colony. **06:00 pm** Departure, crossing Angostura Kirke, Morla Vicuña, Unión, Collingwood, and Sarmiento channels.



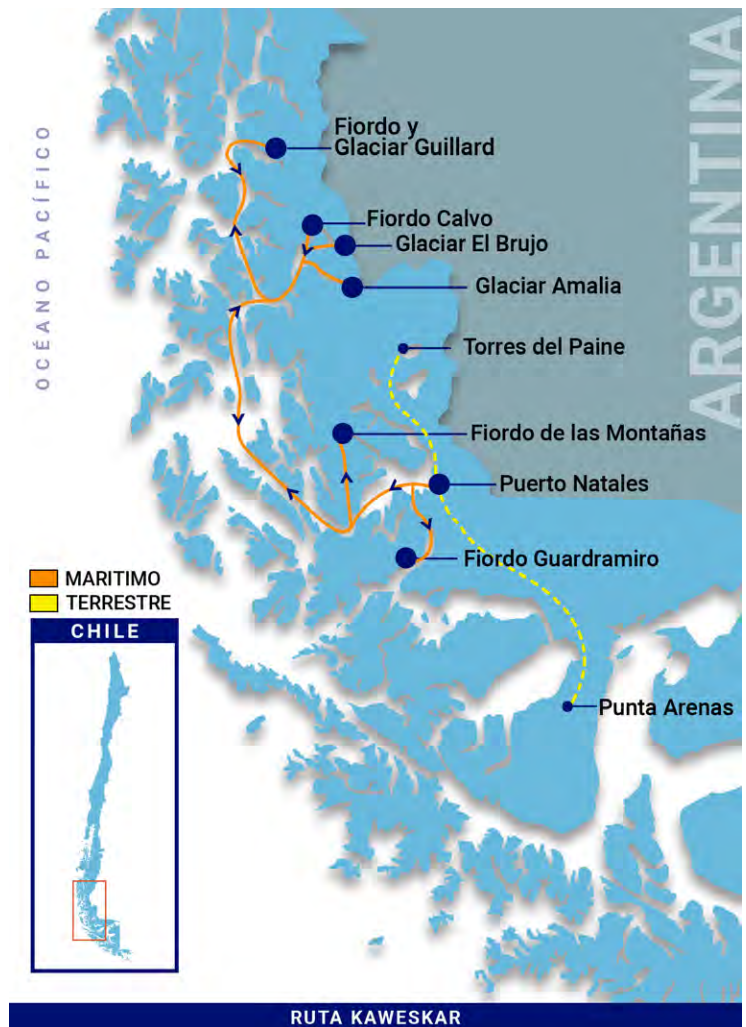
DAY 2: 06:00 am Heading north through Pitt Canal. On the port side, we will see Chatham Island. **08:45 am** Entering Guillard Fjord. Sailing inside the fjord toward Guillard Glacier. Disembark at the glacier and take a walk around the area, depending on tide conditions. **11:30 am** Departure southbound. **01:00 pm** Lunch. **04:00 pm** Arrival at Amalia Glacier, boat trips around the bay of this wonderful place. If weather conditions allow, we will disembark, as this glacier is in constant movement and has modified its beach and surroundings. **08:30 pm** Dinner on board. Departure toward El Brujo Glacier.

DAY 3: 08:00 am Arrival at El Brujo Glacier. **09:15 am** If weather and ice conditions allow, it will be possible to go down and view this glacier from a closer rock. **11:30 am** Departure toward the spectacular Calvo Fjord. **01:00 pm** Lunch. **04:00 pm** – Arrival at Calvo Fjord, where an excursion is made on a boat suitable for navigating among the ice, called Capitán Constantino, visiting the Fernando Glacier, Capitán Constantino Glacier, and Alipio Glacier, among others. **08:00 pm** Departure toward the Mountain Fjord.

DAY 4: 08:00 am Visit to the Mountain Fjord, where four glaciers descending from the Sarmiento Mountains to the sea can be observed, two of them included in our log. **09:00 am** Visit to Alsina Glacier, disembarkation by exploration boats to explore this small bay and appreciate the beauty of the glacier and the enormous surrounding mountains. **10:30 am** Return to the ship; we continue sailing through the Mountain Fjord toward Bernal Glacier. **11:00 am** Disembark at Bernal Glacier. A walk begins through a small native forest and along a trail crossing a small glacial lagoon. We continue walking over the frontal and lateral moraines until reaching the glacier front. Here we will have the opportunity to touch some ice and observe the retreat phase of a glacier that no longer reaches the sea. **12:45 pm** Return to the ship, which is taking on pure natural water from a waterfall. This water is used on board for all ship services. **01:30 pm** Lunch. **02:00 pm** Departure, sailing through the Mountain Fjord, where we can see Herman Glacier and Zamudio Glacier. **05:00 pm** Crossing of Angostura White. **08:30 pm** Farewell party, Captain's dinner, and dance. Navigation through Almirante Montt Gulf.

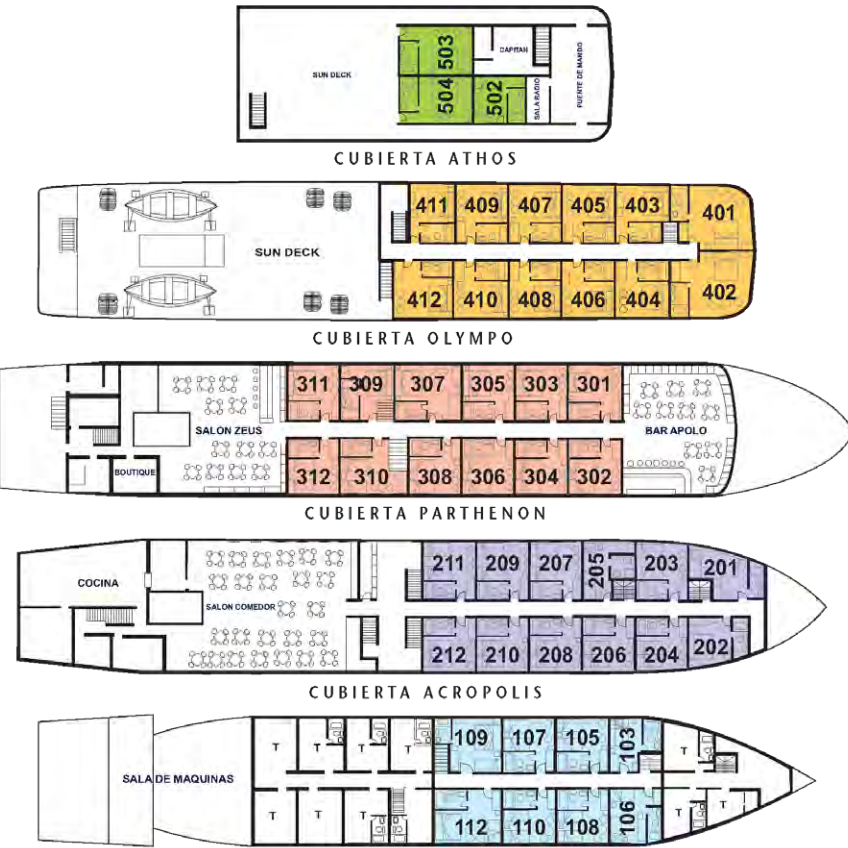
DIA 5: Between **02:00 am** and **07:00 am** Arrival at Puerto Natales. Between **08:00 am** and **09:30 am** Passenger disembarkation. End of the cruise.

Note: Schedules and excursions are subject to weather, wind, tide, and ice conditions, at the Captain's discretion.





The Motor Vessel Skorprios III has a capacity of up to 92 passengers, based on double occupancy, in 46 comfortable cabins configured with double, twin, and single beds spread across five decks, all with private bathrooms, LED TVs, ambient music, and safes. The ship also features two cozy bar lounges and a spacious dining room.



The vessel Skorprios III, call sign CBSK, IMO number 9143908, was built in Chile under Chilean and international maritime regulations such as SOLAS and IMO, and is classified by Overseas Marine Certification Services (OMCS). Class number 20953 – 9525928, valid until 07/31/2030, on which date it is automatically renewed. It also holds a valid Safety Certificate issued by the Chilean Maritime Authority (DGTM).
